This 3,110 sq ft modern, handcrafted log home is ensconced by mature landscape, a private pond, and a lush pasture with a creek running through it. Set on 8 acres of flat land, with sweeping views of the Tetons and postcard sunsets, it is ripe for a new guest house. The gray-washed logs were crafted using traditions and skills passed down through generations. Artfully laid out, the 3 bedroom, 3 1/2 bathroom squarely designed home balances privacy and flow. The 1,218 sq ft of south-facing deck is ideal for entertaining and relaxing by the pond. Outbuildings include a heated 3-car garage and a run-in barn with plenty of room for tack and hay. The serene neighborhood attracts wildlife, yet it is just a few miles from town, schools, and a bike path that goes all the way to Grand Teton National Park.









Equestrian Compound Ensconced in Nature

A horse lover's paradise, this 8-acre compound is tucked into the pastoral Shootin' Iron Ranches neighborhood like a dream. The 3,110 square-foot modern log home lives simply and is surrounded by mature landscape, a private pond, and a spacious, heated 3-car garage. Behind the manicured lawns, a lush pasture with a creek running through it, brings an Andrew Wyeth painting to mind. There is something about the symmetry of the land and the house that is romantic, beginning with the serene feeling you get when you drive into the circular driveway. Towering aspen trees quake above. A terraced garden lines the wooden path between the garage and the house. Two rows of spruce trees on either side of the fence-lined property create shady spaces that buffer the boundary and create a Zen-like courtyard for lounging.





Energy Efficient, Square Cabin Features 360 Degree Views The gray-washed log home, designed and built by Logcrafters in Pinedale, WY, was modern from the get-go. The "sandwiched walls" create exceptional energy efficiency with hearty three-sided logs and "butt and pass" corners on the outside, a framed plaster wall on the inside and insulation in between. Its artfully cubed layout balances privacy and creates an energetic flow between the house and the flat land surrounding it.

A spacious primary bedroom with glass doors leading out to the deck and an en-suite guest room take up one cube; another cube, separated by an archway, encompasses the light-filled living room/dining room with a wood-burning fireplace and galley kitchen with iron and glass features, granite countertops and Mexican tiled flooring; and a third cube offers privacy for a cozy media room and a third en-suite bedroom in the front of the house. Each of the three en-suite bathrooms have tiled showers and countertops. The recently renovated primary bath includes a soaking tub, tile, and glass shower.









Deck Brings the Outside In

The south-facing deck overlooking the pond further inspires harmony in nature. In the back, a flat 4-acre of pasture lined with buck and rail fencing has sweeping views of the Tetons and postcard sunsets. A footpath from the deck leads you on a short nature walk around the private pond by way of an arched bridge.

With 1,218 square feet of Alaskan Cedar and built in benches, the deck invites the inside out because it links almost every room in the house. It winds around the oversized master bedroom, creating a perfect spot to unwind with a cocktail and watch horses play in the pasture under the pink sky. A dining terrace in the middle connects the primary bedroom to the media room, with the solarium in between. The solarium, one of the latest additions to the house, has a river rock floor that conducts the sun. It leads to an open living room/dining room centered on an iconic stone hearth open to all sides. Hand-peeled, log trusses draw the eye up and add a wonderfully warm texture to the interior.





Secluded Location Near Town Shootin Iron is a relaxed and friendly neighborhood, home to a mix of western riders, an International polo community, and an established group of locals who enjoy privacy.


It is also conveniently located within 10 minutes of town, schools, and exponential outdoor adventures, including a pathway system that links 70-miles of bike rides. Many of the children use the pathway system to ride to school on their e-bikes.


Beyond the secluded ranch, untamed forests, riparian vegetation, and high alpine ridgelines attract migrating elk, moose, and deer. Nearby wetlands are on the flight path of a diverse population of trumpeter swans, cranes, and wild songbirds. The wildlife, which migrates through this National Park locked island, alludes to the abundant outdoor recreation. Jackson is home to world-class skiing, hiking, fly fishing, and river rafting, all of which are within 30 minutes from the ranch.

The snow-capped mountains that melt into the streams below are all part of the 360-degree views. A backdrop of gigantic cottonwoods separates the free-flowing creek from the Snake River beyond.

Distinctive Craftsman-Built Structure

It's no surprise that the unique log cabin design has been celebrated in multiple books and magazines, including The Log Home Book and Homestead Magazine. The floorplan is an homage to an Asian aesthetic, with each cube thoughtfully situated to maximize the natural light and picturesque mountain vistas.














Energy Efficient
















Artfully Landscaped

The impressive 1,218 square feet of deck has ample built-in seating on the south side of the home. It is ideal for entertaining, dining, or relaxing after you put the horses out to pasture. Beyond the deck, the landscaping offers a variety of flat open lawn space for games, shade under aspens and evergreens, and a beautiful blend of perennials. Lush cattails and wildflowers around the pond augment the sense of tranquility and beauty.
